Scrappy Appliqué Workshop Supply List



- Collage Fabric: Various fabrics for the appliqué piece (that's the pumpkin). 5-10 fat eighth-sized pieces of different fabrics
- Background fabric: For a table runner app. 1
 yard, for a wallhanging 1/2 yard or just a bit
 more than your piece will be. Note: Some of
 my samples have a pieced background made
 of old denim you might want to prepare a pieced
 background upfront.



- Batting: low loft, same size as background fabric/your project; any leftover piece will do
- **Template:** This is a free pumpkin appliqué template (we'll have them there for you, but you can also download them free on Shannon Brinkley's website here)
- Fusible web: 1 yard of Mistyfuse, SoftFuse or alike; enough to cover the back of all your collage fabric
- Interfacing: Lightweight, non-woven, fusible interfacing, like Pellon 906f, the size of your appliqué (=your pumpkin(s)); 1/2 1 yard will be fine
- Marking tool: a pen, pencil, chalk or Micronpen don't use Frixxon Pens or Sharpies
- Coordinating thread
- Clear polyester thread (optional: to secure the appliqué pieces invisibly)
- Bobbin thread (optional: you may want to use it, especially if you use clear thread)
- **Stabilizer** (any embroidery stabilizer, optional: at the very end if you choose to secure the edges of your appliqué)
- **Sewing Machine** (in good working order)

You may or may not come to the sewing part of your project, depending on how big a pumpkin you make and how fast you work. Approximately half of the students leave this class with an appliqué piece to sew it on/finish it later at home, the other half gets to stitch in class and even finishes. Both is fine!

Don't bring your machine if you know you want to take your time. You will be leaving the class with all the knowledge you need to finish your piece at home

- Bring your free-motion foot if you have one

These are good helpers:

- The usual suspects: scissors, rotary cutter, straight pins
- Personal little iron if you want, Teflon sheet/parchment paper + a pressing surface (an old towel is ideal)
- baggies for extra cut collage pieces
- basting pins or spray (in case you get that far)
- Materials Preparation (100% optional!)
 - Apply fusible web to the back of your collage fabric according to the manufacturer's instructions.
